I am a member of the public who is disgusted by the utterly inadequate action of the press and government to get the press' house in order after the hacking scandal. IPSO is laughable. The government's dodging of any action on redress for victims is a disgrace.

It is important that the costs provisions of the Crime and Courts Act are implemented, for without this the Leveson recommendations are fatally weakened as there is no incentive for the big newspapers to sign up to a Leveson compliant regulator.
