

# ABOUT THE PRP

The PRP is not a regulator. The PRP has a very clear remit: to consider whether press regulators meet all of the recognition criteria. The PRP will grant recognition to press regulators that comply with the 29 criteria.



The Charter guarantees the PRP's independence from outside influence, including from government or the press.

## Being recognised allows a regulator to demonstrate that it:



is **independent** of the print and/or online publishers they regulate



is **appropriately funded**



**protects the public** from excessive intrusion by the press



**provides prompt and proper redress** to the public when needed



**upholds press standards**



**protects the public** from being seriously misled



**protects journalists** by providing a whistleblowing hotline



**upholds the principles of freedom of speech and the interests of the public**
