

TIMELINE OF THE PRESS RECOGNITION PANEL (PRP)



July 2011

Prime Minister announces public, judge-led Inquiry into the culture, practices and ethics of the press.



November 2012

Rt Hon Lord Justice Leveson publishes his Report and Recommendations for the future regulation of the press.



February 2013

Proposal for a draft Royal Charter published.



April 2013

Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act includes measures to protect the Charter from change.



October 2013

Royal Charter creates the PRP to independently oversee press regulation.



November 2014

PRP Board appointed and the PRP formally comes into existence.



June/July 2015

Consultation on PRP's approach to receiving and assessing applications from regulators.



September 2015

Regulators can apply to the PRP for recognition that they meet the Charter criteria.



November 2015

Provisions of the Crime and Courts Act 2013 come into force.



February/March 2016

PRP consults on proposals for carrying out reviews and charging fees to regulators.



September 2016

PRP reports to Parliament and the public on the effectiveness of the recognition system.
