I believe that 'guaranteed access to justice incentive' (section 40 of the Crime and Courts Act) should be enacted since significant newspaper groups remain outside IMPRESS. Under the current regulatory system, there is little incentive not to use the sort of tactics we saw revealed in the hacking inquiry, including the hacking of Milly Dowler's phone.

It seems to me as time goes by we are beginning to forget how serious were the crimes committed by elements of the press. I do not believe that legitimate journalism would be affected by proper regulation; people in the UK are reasonable enough to make sensible judgements in areas such as public interest.
